



Located in County Clare on the Atlantic coast, Doolin was once a quiet fishing village but has long established itself as the most musical village in Ireland. It is a mecca for traditional musicians and revelers alike, with more musicians per square mile than any other place in the world.

Traditional Irish music

Most nights of the year there will be live music sessions in all four of the village's pubs, which are world renowned and have become synonymous with traditional Irish music. Pull up a chair, sample a local brew and be regaled in Gus O'Connor's Pub, McDermott's Pub, McGann's Pub or Fitzpatrick's Pub.

Other things to do in Doolin

Doolin Cliff Walk (marked on the map as Cliffs of Moher Walking Trail) - You can follow this spectacular coastal walking trail all the way to the Cliffs of Moher (5 miles, 2.5 hours).

Doolin Rent-a-Bike - If you're feeling more adventurous, take on one of the suggested bike routes which can be found on doolinrentabike.ie. The shop is located behind the Doolin Deli on Fisher St.

Doonagore Castle - A 20-minute walk along the main road will take you to Doonagore Castle, a 16th-century tower house with expansive views overlooking Doolin Point.

Doolin Pitch and Putt - This 18-hole links course is open to the public and offers clubs for rent. Located off of Fisher St, about 5 minutes from the village.

Shopping

Visit Irish Crafts on the main street to shop for handcrafted knitwear, accessories and homeware, or pop into one of the sweater shops, music shops, craft stores or stained-glassed art stores on Fisher St.
